

Signs and symptoms of chronic graftversus-host disease (cGVHD)

It's important to notice any new or changing symptoms and share them with your transplant team right away. Print this list and put it somewhere you'll see it to help you keep track of possible GVHD-related symptoms.

Skin, nails, and hair	Digestive system
Skin texture changes (thickening)	☐ Nausea or vomiting
☐ Nail changes	☐ Diarrhea or constipation
Rash	☐ Belly pain or cramping
Unusual hair loss or thinning	Joints and muscles
☐ Itchy skin	Arthritis-like symptoms (pain and stiffness)
Eyes	☐ Muscle aches or pain, cramps, or weakness
☐ Dry eyes	☐ Difficulty walking distances or down stairs
☐ Irritation that won't go away	Lungs
☐ Blurred vision	Cough that doesn't go away
☐ Teary eyes	Shortness of breath (ie, if you're breathing rapidly)
Mouth and throat	☐ Trouble breathing, possibly due to wheezing
☐ Sores or irritation	or coughing
☐ Trouble opening your mouth	Genitals
Pain and sensitivity to temperature and spices	☐ Irritation or dryness
 Dry mouth, increasing risk for cavities along gums and between teeth 	☐ Rash☐ Painful intercourse
Painless, lacy white lines on tongue or inner cheeks	Other
